Initial Orientation Courses in German Culture, Values and Language

What kind of course is this? Participants will gain valuable and useful knowledge that they can use for all areas of everyday life, as well as the necessary German vocabulary and expressions. The basic German language skills and knowledge about their new surroundings will help participants adjust to their life in Germany.

How long are the courses? Each course lasts between 3-4 months and is part-time.

Who can participate in the courses? Initial orientation courses are primarily aimed at refugees with an unclear asylum perspective. If there are free spaces in the course, recognized refugees and tolerated (Geduldete) can also participate, provided that they cannot (yet) take part in an integration course.

Participation is free of charge.

Overview of Modules

Module 1: Introduction - Speaking about oneself and others/ Social contacts

Module 2: Shopping and health

Module 3: Everyday life in Germany/Place of residence

Module 4: Mobility and media or Children/Shool or Housing

Module 5: Work/Education

Module 6: Values and Coexistence

Each course consists of six chosen modules and a maximum of 300 class hours. The modules can be chosen freely by the participants. Only the module "Values and coexistence" is mandatory for all participants. It is possible to take a language test (Zertifikat A1) at the end of the course. However, BAMF will not cover the costs of the examination.
